

Your recycling Checklist



Please use this checklist to make sure that we take care of our environment, by recycling all the containers and boxes that you use for your KickStart Breakfast Club.

Recycling Your Cardboard Containers and Boxes


This is the cardboard you need to recycle, by putting it into your normal school cardboard recycling:

- The big cardboard cases that contain the 12 x Anchor Milk packs
- The big cardboard cases that contain the 12 x boxes of Sanitarium Weet-Bix
- The empty Weet-Bix boxes

Recycling Your Empty Milk Packs

Fonterra will give you:

- A smaller **80 litre** recycling bin for putting the empty milk packs in, once they've been rinsed and folded or flattened.
- Bin liners to put inside the **80 litre** bin.
- A larger **240 litre** recycling bin – this is for putting the full bin liners in, until the next visit from the Anchor milkman.
- If you are part of the Fonterra Milk for Schools programme, simply use the **80 and 240 litre** bins that have already been provided to your school.



Where should you place the bins?

- Pop the smaller **80 litre** bin in a place that's easy to access, close to where your KickStart Breakfast is served.
- Please put the large **240 litre** bin in the place that has been agreed with the Anchor milkman to collect the recycling.

What do you need to do with the empty Anchor Milk packs?

8 EASY STEPS:

- 1: Drain any milk so that the milk pack is completely empty, then rinse it out with water.
- 2: We'd prefer you to fold the empty pack (like we show you in the Recycling Guide) – but at a minimum, please make sure you flatten it.
- 3: Then place the folded or flattened milk pack in the lined **80 litre** bin for recycling.
- 4: Once the bin is full, remove the bin liner bag.
- 5: Check that no other waste has been put in the bin liner bag, so that only empty Anchor Milk packs are in there.
- 6: Tie a knot in the top of the bag.
- 7: Pop the bag in the large **240 litre** recycling bin. The Anchor milkman will collect the full bags whenever they visit your school.
- 8: Remember to place a new bin liner in the smaller **80 litre** bin.

An easy guide to recycling




Please follow four easy steps below to recycle all your Anchor milk packs and care for our environment.



One

When the Anchor Milk packs are empty, rinse them out with water and make sure you leave the lids open.




Two

Peel back the triangle flaps from the tops of all the milk packs.



Three

Fully flatten the milk packs with the spout facing towards you, so all of the air escapes before you close the lid.



Four


Once they are fully flattened and sealed, put the Anchor Milk packs into the Fonterra recycling bin for collection.

An easy guide to stacking




You'll be receiving regular deliveries from the Anchor milkman, so it's good to get a system in place for making sure they are stored well.

TOP VIEW




One

To make sure your milk boxes don't fall over, stack them using this easy interlocking system.



Two

For safety, it's best not to stack them more than five cases high.



Three

If a box is damaged or leaking, keep it out of the pile, and call your Anchor milkman for a replacement.

Using up your milk

If another delivery arrives before you have used all the milk from your first delivery, make sure you stack it separately.

Use all the milk from each delivery before you start on the new pile.
